
This is in response to your Freedom of Information Act request for a copy of the Individual Deceased Personnel File (IDPF) pertaining to Matthew D. Musolino.



A telegram dated April 23rd 1945 stated that my brother Matthew D. Musolino, 20,130,787, was killed in action on Corregidor, Philippine Islands.

Now my mother has been told that she can have her son's body brought to the U.S.A. We were also notified that he was buried in the U. S. Cemetery No. 1, Mariveles, Bataan Peninsula, P. I.



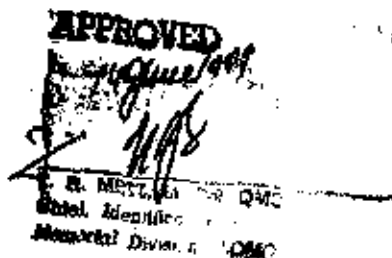

REMARKS

Field Board Proceedings have been received recommending identification of remains of Unknown X-837 as Pvt. Matthew D. Musolino, 20 130 787.

War Department records reveal that Pvt. Matthew D. Musolino, 20 130 787, a member of Co. E, 503 Parachute Infantry was killed in action on 16 February 1945 Corregidor, P.I.

From copies of Morning Reports of Co. E, 503rd Parachute Infantry, dated 16 February 1945, it is noted that Pvt. Musolino's status was changed from duty to MIA after jump on Corregidor Island, P.I. On 29 March 1945 the status of Pvt Musolino was changed from MIA to Killed in Action, Corregidor Island, P.I. as of 16 February 1945.

A Casualty Report indicates that Pvt. Musolino was seen to drift over a cliff which dropped sharply to a narrow beach. Evidence indicated that he was killed during the descent on the rocks.

The following is an extract from letter dated 15 June 1946 from Pvt. Musolino's sister, Mrs. Concetta Passaretti:

"A telegram dated April 23rd 1945 stated that my brother Matthew D. Musolino, 20130787, was killed in action on Corregidor, Philippine Islands. Now my mother has been told that she can have her son's body brought back to the U.S.A. We were also notified that he was buried in the U.S. Cemetery No. 1, Mariveles, Bataan Peninsula, P.I."

The remains of Unknown X-837 were originally interred as Unknown X-13 in Grave 253, Row 9, Plot 1, of the USAF Cemetery Mariveles No. 1, Bataan, Luzon, P.I. These remains were later reinterred as Unknown X-355 in Grave 1653, Row 13, Plot 2, of the USAF Cemetery Manila #2, Luzon, P.I. They are now stored as Unknown X-837 in the AGHS Mausoleum, Manila, P.I.

The dental chart prepared for Unknown X-837 compares very favorably with the dental records of Pvt. Musolino.

The shoe size listed for remains of X-837 is identical with the size recorded in Army records for Pvt. Musolino.

On the basis of the findings from the Field, as explained herein, it is recommended that the identification of the remains of Unknown X-837, as proposed by the Field, be approved.

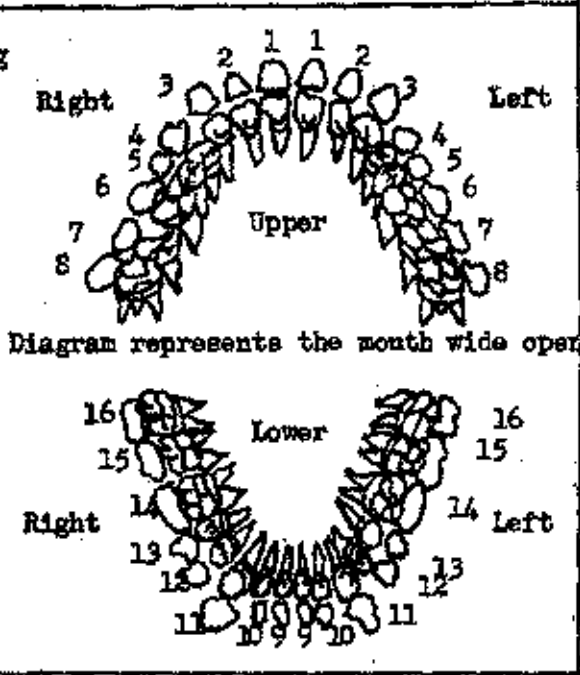

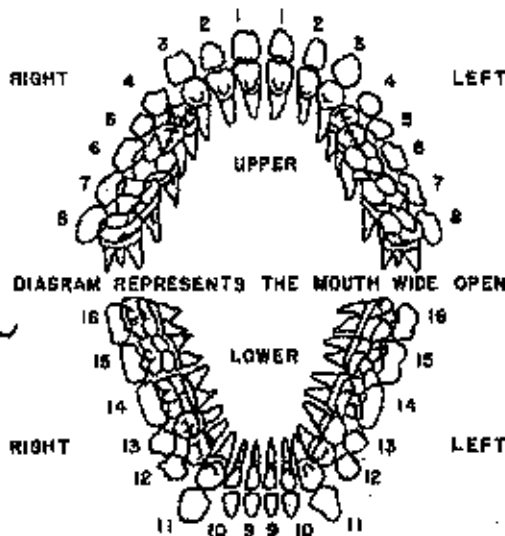

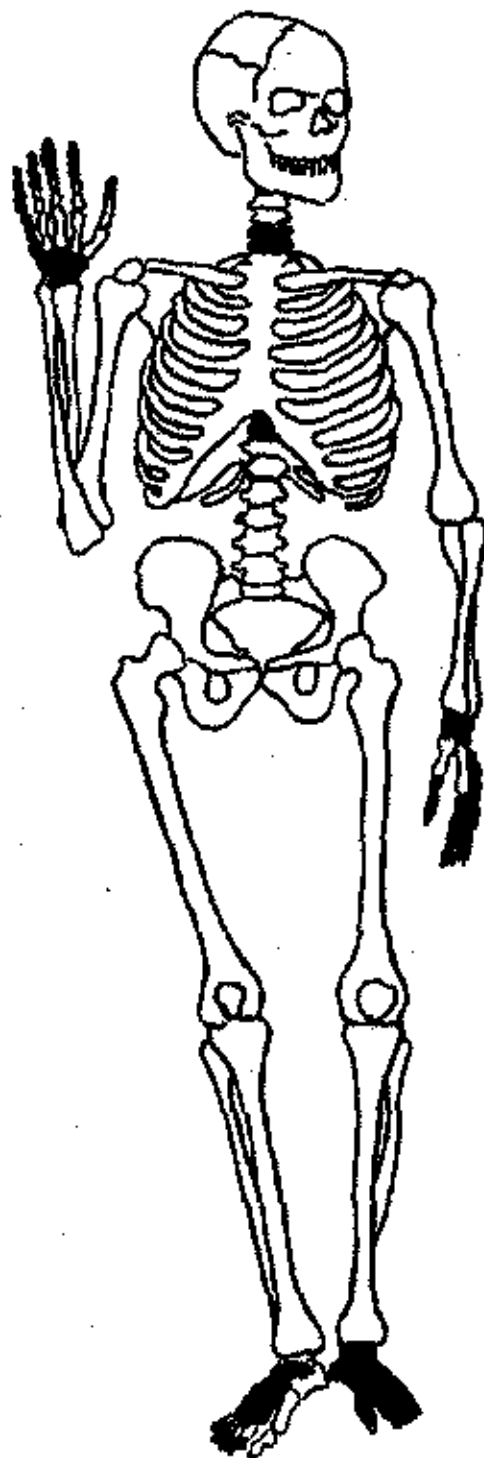

Every effort is being expended by this Office and the American Graves Registration Service overseas to recover and identify the remains of all deceased American personnel of World War II. I feel sure that you will appreciate the tremendous complexities of this undertaking, as well as the amount of time its proper accomplishment demands. To facilitate this project, complete dental records on an individual are helpful and, in some instances, essential. 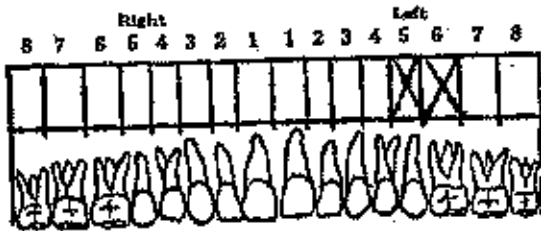

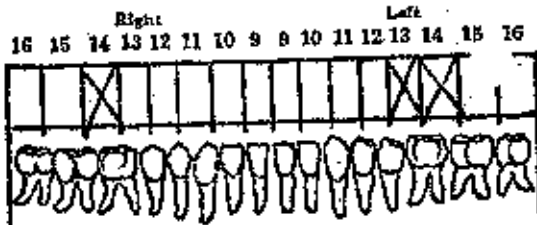

I am now at liberty to furnish you with additional information concerning the remains of your son, the late Private Matthew D. Musolino.

At this time, I may inform you that the official report of burial has been received and discloses that the remains of your son were originally buried in the United States Armed Forces Cemetery Mariveles #1, Mariveles, Luzon, Philippine Islands, but were later disinterred by our American Graves Registration Personnel, and reinterred in Plot 2, Row 13, Grave 1352, in the United States Armed Forces Cemetery Manila #1, located within the city limits of Manila, Philippine Islands.

The report further indicates that these remains have now been exhumed and are being held at American Graves Registration Service Mausoleum, Manila, Philippine Islands, pending disposition instructions from the next of kin, either for return to the United States or for permanent burial in an overseas cemetery.

There are inclosed informational pamphlets regarding the Return of World War II Dead Program, including a Disposition Form on which you may indicate your desires in this matter. Upon receipt of the properly completed form, you may be assured that the Department of the Army will attempt to comply with your instructions as indicated thereon.

In order that this office may take immediate action toward the final disposition of the remains of your son, it is urged that you complete the inclosed form, "Request for Disposition of Remains", and mail it to this office, without delay, in the inclosed self-addressed envelope which requires no postage.

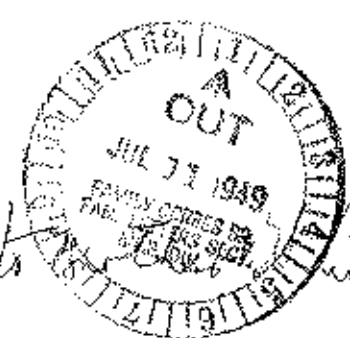

After Action Report

Radio personnel dropped at 0840 hr. 16 Feb. 1945 on Corregidor Island. The first half hour was spent in assembling personnel and radio equipment at the Regimental CP. Personnel arrived with radios at 0915 hours and opened nets. Radio SCR-694 and SCR-300 contact made with 38th Division Headquarters and 149th Inf. Regt. on mainland at 0920 hour. Reception good at both ends - traffic being transmitted. Radio SCR-300 net established with 3d Bn., 503 Prcht. RCT at 0940 hour. This Bn at that time was the only tactical unit on the ground requiring radio or wire communication with Regt. Hq 462d FA Bn. Hq. was established near Regt'l CP. Radio SCR -694 communication established with rear base at Mindoro, 1000 hour. Perfect reception at both ends. Beach landing made by 3d Bn 34th Inf. at 1030 hour. Radio SCR-300 communication established. XI Corps radio SCR-399, brought in to work back to Corps by Rock Force, contacted land mine upon landing and was damaged beyond repair. Established radio communication continued until 1415 hour when 3d Bn. with remainder of Regt'l communication section and Engineer Company jumped on Corregidor. Upon landing, 2d Bn. entered established SCR-300 radio net. Engineer Company assembled vicinity of Regt'l CP., therefore no need for radio or wire communication. Remainder of Regt'l Comm Section assembled at Regt'l CP with Message Center and Wire equipment. Message Center established and plans made for wire communication. More radio bundles recovered at at 1500 hour radio SCR-284 voice communication established with naval support party afloat by JASCO officers attached to RCT for mission. Beach landing by 1st Bn. 503d Prcht. RCT at 1645 hour- 17 Feb. Radio SCR-300 communication established. Established radio communication until 19 February 45, when radio team from XI Corps arrived to replace SCR-399 lost upon beach landing. Radio brought in was TW-12 but was damaged upon arrival and communication to Corps unsuccessful.

Medical Detachment, 503d Para Infantry

At 0700 hour 16 February 1945 members of the 503d Regimental Combat Team loaded into transport planes at San Jose Mindoro, Philippine Islands, in preparation for the jump on Corregidor, Philippine Islands. Members of the Medical Detachment jumped with the Headquarters Sections and Platoons to which they were assigned. The first paratroopers jumped at 0833 hours. As the jump fields were small and rough, and a high wind blowing, only seven or eight men were jumped at a time. Because of this precaution, jump casualties, though high, were not as great as had been anticipated. Some few were shot by Japanese Marines while descending, but the jump caught the Japanese by complete surprise and unprepared to resist a parachute landing.

I regret the necessity of writing to you with reference to your son, the late Private Matthew D. Musolino.

Every effort is being expended by this Office and the American Graves Registration Service overseas to recover and identify the remains of all deceased American personnel of World War II. I feel sure that you will appreciate the tremendous complexities of this undertaking, as well as the amount of time its proper accomplishment demands. To facilitate this project, complete dental records on an individual are helpful and, in some instances, essential. In view of the fact that military dental records do not always include work accomplished prior to entry into service, it is often necessary to request this information from the family of a decedent.



It is with deep regret that you are advised that, up to the present time, information pertaining to the burial of the remains of your brother has not been received in this office. An inquiry is being made to obtain information regarding his remains. Upon completion of this inquiry you will be advised as to the results.

The War Department has now been authorized to remove, at Government expense, to the final resting place designated by the next of kin, the remains of those American citizens who died while serving overseas with our armed forces during this war.

When the necessary preliminaries have been completed, a letter with an information pamphlet and a "Request for Disposition" form attached will be sent to the next of kin of those American dead. The "Request for Disposition" form, when properly filled out, will constitute the formal expression of the next of kin's detailed desires. Since letters to next of kin will be dispatched automatically and according to the records here, communications with this office regarding this subject will not be necessary.
